Enthusiastic volunteers completed projects for 33 nonprofit and service agencies across Boulder County. Collectively, they volunteered almost 2,400 hours - that's equal to \$46,000!

What I Volunteer! Day accomplished in just four hours would otherwise take one person, working full-time, over an entire year to complete. Volunteers removed 100 bags of trash from Boulder Creek, decorated 200 meal bags for Project Angel Heart to deliver to people living with life-threatening illnesses, sewed 19 foster quilts for Project Linus to give to foster care children, planted 300 trees and shrubs at Bullhead Gulch with Lafayette Parks, Open Space and Golf, and painted and dry-walled an entire house for Habitat for Humanity.
